2018 scholarship award



Camp Lewis was built and opened in 1917 and the Church held it's first service on March 7, 1917. Since there wasn't a church at Camp Lewis, the DuPont Church filled the need and became known as the Campside Church. This exhibit will be on display through the summer months.
